12. Steve Kovesci Jr. Award to Honorary Firefighter Carter Ray
Assistant Fire Chief Andree advised the following:

On June 9th, 2020, Carter was diagnosed with Leukemia. Within a few hours, his whole life was turned upside down. He went from being a normal kid who played sports and lived for fun, to a kid who was fighting for his life. Cancer is very scary. Carter spent months in the hospital fighting off many life threatening infections. He suffered with nausea, weakness and pain. After hundreds of chemo treatments and thousands of chemo pins, Carter is left with some side effects that may never go away.

As of Tuesday, October 4th, 2022, Carter has completed his final treatments after 2-1/2 years. Carter is now Cancer free.

Carter has been the most amazing, positive person and is definitely coming out of this much stronger than he went into. He is battling to get back to the kid he once was. Carter is slowly getting back to playing baseball, planning on taking pitching lessons, and is currently playing Blackcats Basketball this winter. He also hopes to fulfill his dream of running a marathon in the future. Carter has learned so much throughout his battle. He even shared some of his personal advice for all of us: "Be happy, and have fun . . . be sure to thank God for every second that you get. Thank you for listening, caring, and thank you for all your support."

Tonight, the Griffith Fire Department is proud to present Carter B. Ray with "The Steven Kovesci, Jr. Award," the award for courage and perseverance.


QUESTIONS/COMMENTS FROM THE FLOOR


